What is biodynamic wine?

The Practice of biodynamic farming in viticulture has become popular in recent years. There are over 500 biodynamic wine producers worldwide with this list continually growing. For a wine to be labelled “biodynamic” it has to meet stringent standards set by the Demeter Association which is an internationally recognized certifying body.

To meet these standards a vineyard must follow nine biodynamic preparations. These are made from cow manure, quartz and seven medicinal plants such as stinging nettles, dandelion flowers, chamomile and oak bark. Of the nine preparations three of these are used as sprays either directly to the vines or the farmed soil itself. The other six are applied to the vineyard as compost.

This Type of viticulture views the farm as a cohesive interconnected living system and also works with the cycles of seasons and moon phases.

The benefits?

Viticulturists who follow these practices claim to have achieved improvements in the health of their vineyards in biodiversity, soil fertility, crop nutrition and also in pest, weed and disease management.

Wine makers claim to have noted stronger, clearer, more vibrant tastes. Biodynamic wines are said to have better expressions of ‘terroir’ which is to say better represent its place of origin in its aroma, flavour and texture.

Certified organic wines

In Australia organic grape production has increased by 120% between 2011 & 2014. Organic wines are simply that of grapes grown processed and bottled in accordance with organic farming practices and meeting the current standards set in Australia by the Australia Certified Organic or National Association for Sustainable Agriculture. This excludes the use of artificial or synthetic chemicals, fertilizers, pesticides, fungicides and or herbicides.

Viticulturists employ different methods to keep weeds and pests under control. Organic farmers work with nature by boosting a vineyards biodiversity. Practicies such as introducing other crops to provide habitat for beneficial insects to keep problem ones at bay or as simple as having sheep graze between vines to maintain the grass and weeds.

Benifits of organic wine?

Besides that of more sustainable farming practices and that of not dealing with the side effects of chemical run off and the resulting impact of soil and water quality or the residues of these harmful chemicals finding their way into the finished product. Organic wines to meet Australian certified standards have half the legal limit of preservative sulphur dioxide (pres 220) which is good news for those of us sensitive to sulphur and is less inclined to give you a “wine hangover”. However besides been a healthier choice and been better for the environment taste can be a leading discion in choosing an organic wine, pure and delicious.

Vegan and Vegetarian wines

“But isn’t wine made from grapes?” I hear you ask.... Well your not wrong however wine producers traditionally employ a range of animal related products including eggs, milk, gelatine and isinglass (a type gelatine made from fish bladder) to fine or clarify their wines. (this process removes tiny molecules such as proteins and tannins that give young wine a hazy appearance, the end result gives the clear bright appearance we all know and love, this will also soften tannins)

Alternatives to create vegan wine, wine makers use clay based fining agents such as bentonite or activated charcoal. Gentle extraction is an alternative process used to soften out the tannins in a wine.

Preservative free wines

Why is there preservatives in wine when alcohol is a natural preservative? To help protect against oxidation and bacterial spoilage. Sulphur dioxide (preservative 220) is the most commonly used. Australian food standards allow for a maximum of 250ppm (parts per million) in dry wines and 300ppm for sweet wines.

No added preservative wine or often labelled as “preservative free” wine can often still have traces of sulphur dioxide as a natural product of fermentation. In Australia less than 10ppm then no mention of the preservative needs to be on the label.

But isn’t certified organic wine preservative free? No not to meet the ACO or NASA standards. The amount of preservative allowed is about 50% of what can be used under Australian food standards for wine. This is usually 120ppm. Also with the addition of stelvin caps less sulphur dioxide is used due to a more perfect seal. Corked wines and cask wines further more generally have higher levels of sulphur dioxide due to the packaging been slightly permeable.

This addition of Sulphur Dioxide is what many contribute to the “wine Hangover” particularly in those that are sensitive to sulphur.
